Pastor's Corner

The Influence of some Biblical Teachings on Modern Ethics

Beloved Parishioners.

My reflection today is focused on the influence of biblical teaching on modern ethics. Teachings from the Bible have influenced various aspects of contemporary life, ranging from personal conduct to societal laws. These Biblical teachings have profoundly shaped modern ethical thoughts and practices because they offer moral guidelines that impact on values such as justice, charity, and human dignity.

Some of the Biblical passages that laid solid groundwork for modern or contemporary ethics include the Decalogue or Ten Commandments (Exodus 20:1-17) and the Sermon on the Mount (Matthew 5-7). The Ten Commandments, given to Moses on Mount Sinai, represent a cornerstone of Biblical ethics. These directives which contain prohibitions against murder, theft, and bearing false witness, establish a foundational moral code that has been integrated into many modern legal systems. In the New Testament, Jesus' Sermon on the Mount offers a radical reinterpretation of traditional moral teachings of the Jews of His time. Concepts like loving one's enemies and turning the other cheek emphasize compassion and forgiveness. Subsequently, these teachings have influenced modern ethical views on conflict resolution and interpersonal relationships, promoting a more empathetic approach to moral dilemmas.

There are some crucial values derived from Biblical teachings and they include charity and compassion, as well as justice and fairness. Considering charity and compassion, the Biblical imperative to "love your neighbor as yourself" has greatly influenced ethical norms surrounding charity and social justice. This principle has inspired numerous social welfare programs and charitable organizations that aim to alleviate suffering and promote human dignity. Adequately considering justice and fairness, the Biblical concepts of justice,

such as the call to "act justly, love mercy, and walk humbly with your God" (Micah 6:8), have shaped modern understandings of fairness and equity. These teachings emphasize the importance of addressing systemic injustices and advocating for the marginalized, influencing contemporary discussions on social justice and equality.

The influence of these Biblical teachings on the modern legal or ethical system cannot be overestimated. Many modern legal systems incorporate principles derived from Biblical teachings. For instance, the idea of justice as fairness, deeply rooted in the Biblical tradition, aligns with contemporary human rights standards. The emphasis on the inherent worth and dignity of every individual reflects Biblical values, which have been instrumental in shaping human rights legislation.

Still examining the influences of Biblical teachings on the legal system, we see that theses influences advocate for a rule of law that ensures accountability and justice. This principle resonates with modern democratic ideals, where laws are designed to uphold ethical standards and provide recourse for grievances. The Biblical emphasis on justice as a divine mandate underpins the development of legal systems that strive for impartiality and equity.

Be that as it may, while these Biblical teachings provide a moral foundation, their interpretation can vary widely. Different religious traditions and denominations may emphasize different aspects of Biblical ethics, leading to divergent views on issues like gender roles, sexuality, and bioethics. This diversity can sometimes create challenges in applying Biblical principles uniformly in a modern context.

Theme: Faith, Trust, and Humility of a Child

25th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year B, September 22, 2024 First Reading: Wisdom 2:12, 17-20, Second Reading: James 3:16-4:3, Gospel: Mark 9:30-37

Last week in the gospel, Jesus asked His disciples "who do people say that the son of man is?" For you to know a person very well you need to develop a true and genuine relationship with that person. You need to spend quality time with that person and build a relationship of trust in a way that you know him much better. In the same way, for us to know Christ we must build a personal and deep relationship with Jesus; we must spend time with Jesus in prayer and adoration and build a relationship of trust and confidence. In that way we come to know Him very closely and He would reveal Himself.

In today's gospel, we see the apostles quarreling and arguing over who is the greatest among them while Jesus was talking about His suffering and death and journey to Jerusalem where He would be crucified. They were more concerned about who occupies the position of authority. This attitude of the apostles proves that they have not really understood their Master. But Jesus instead of getting angry with them, called them to Himself and gently explained to them how

to be great. If anyone wants to be the greatest or the first, the person must be the servant of all. It means that greatness is found in service and humility.

These struggles for power, prestige and position are what bring jealousy and envy which cause division and bitterness in our families and community. The second reading tells us that wisdom from above has no room for envy, jealousy and bitterness. Thus, to rid ourselves of these evils, Jesus calls us today to imitate the simplicity and trust of the little children who have no power of their own, but rely on others for their sustenance. Let us be like children with total trust, simplicity of heart with no unworthy ambition and jealousy. Today's reading tells us the danger of ungodly ambition which destroys our inner peace and relationship with God and with other people. Let us today pray for wisdom from above that will help us live lives of simplicity, trust, and peace.




Mary's Kitchen

GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

September 22, 2024- 25th Sunday in Ordinary Time



When I was a wet-behind-the-ears seminarian, I was sent for an immersion with the poor. For one month, I lived in a home for adults with developmental disabilities. It was a challenge for me because the residents had significant

communication issues. A 30-year-old man there named Robin was totally deaf and mute. He had Down's Syndrome. He looked like a Viking, with a shock of red hair and a fine beard. But I felt awkward and disconnected from him. All my normal ways of interacting failed. I resigned myself to the fact that we'd never connect.

Then one morning something amazing happened. He was on the living room floor quietly playing with toys. Watching him from a chair, I sensed Jesus' words float into my mind, "Whoever welcomes one such child in my name welcomes me, and whoever welcomes me welcomes not me but the one who sent me" (Mark 9:37). I thought, "Jesus, you must somehow be in Robin." I sheepishly made sure no one else was in the room, and then I spoke in a clear voice: "Jesus, are you there?" Robin did not turn to me and say, "Hi, John. Yes, it's me, Jesus." He kept playing with his toys in silence.

But something changed in me. From that moment on, it was easier to just be with Robin, to joke around with him, to try sign-language with him, to let him be himself, and for me to be myself. His "disabilities" were no longer obstacles to overcome. He became just Robin, my friend. Who in your life seems awkwardly distant or uncomfortable to be with? Next time you see him or her, quietly invoke the name of Jesus, and see how the barriers disappear in you.

Fall Fun Fair


Every year our Youth Ministry participates in Lake Havasu's Fall Fun Fair Community

Fall Fun Fair will be on October 26, 2024 3:00 pm to 8:00 pm at the Rotary Park Ball Fields.






