Pastor's Corner

The October Devotion: The Rosary and Saint Joseph Part 1

Beloved Parishioners,

In this week Pastor's Corner, I wish to dwell on the Rosary and Saint Joseph which is a month we specially dedicate to honoring Saint Joseph and praying the rosary. However, before going into that reflection, I wish to use this opportunity to express my grateful heart to you, all my beloved parishioners, for coming out in large number to honor our own beloved Deacon Patrick. Your presence, prayers and support in different ways are all testimonies of how much Deacon Patrick is loved in our community. We are confident he has gone home in peace to be with the Lord whom he served so well with all his heart, mind and body. As we keep praying for him and his family, I ask you all to keep our parish in special prayers at this moment because Deacon Patrick is a big loss to our parish though gain for heaven. As you all may be aware no one can replace Deacon Patrick here in the parish, but our hope is that God will renew us in His own way. May the soul of Deacon Patrick and the souls of all the faithful departed, through the mercy of God rest in peace. Amen.

In the month of May, I explained that the May devotion to our Blessed Mother points our mind to the need to join our prayers with that of Mary, the mother of Christ and emulate her in virtue, Now we are at the threshold of another month of Marian devotion with a long historical and spiritual significance, the October devotion.

October is associated with Saint Joseph, the husband of the Blessed Virgin and the foster father of Jesus. While the month is primarily dedicated to the Rosary, we Catholics also honor Saint Joseph for his role as the protector of the Holy Family and as a model of faith and virtue. This devotion of October to Saint Joseph was started by Pope Leo XIII, particularly through his encyclical *Quamquam Pluries*, issued in 1889. In this document, he highlights the importance of Saint Joseph as the protector of the Holy Family and the Church. As part of this devotion, Leo XIII also composed a prayer to Saint Joseph, which is often recited by the faithful in October. This prayer

encapsulates the themes of protection, intercession, and devotion that Pope Leo XIII sought to promote in honoring Saint Joseph.

Be that as it may, October in the Catholic Church, is also traditionally dedicated to the devotion of the Holy Rosary. This focus on the Rosary stems from the Church's recognition of the importance of prayer, particularly the intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary. This devotion invites us to deepen our relationship with Christ through the contemplation of His life and the mysteries of faith.

The Rosary has its origins in the early Middle Ages, evolving from the practice of praying the Psalter. Early monks and laypeople used strands of beads to count prayers, particularly the Our Father and Hail Mary. By the 13th century, the Rosary as we know it began to take shape, largely popularized by St. Dominic and the Dominican Order. It was during the 16th century that Pope Pius V established the Rosary's current structure, emphasizing the importance of meditation on the life of Christ.

October became particularly associated with the Rosary after the Battle of Lepanto in 1571, where Christians, invoking the intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary through the Rosary, achieved a significant naval victory against the Ottoman Empire. The Battle of Lepanto, fought on October 7, 1571, was a crucial naval engagement between the Holy League, a coalition of Christian states, and the Ottoman Empire. During the 16th century, the Ottoman Empire was expanding aggressively into Europe, threatening Christian territories and maritime trade routes. The rise of Ottoman power prompted fears among European nations, leading to the formation of the Holy League, which included Spain, the Papal States, and the Venetian Republic. Pope Pius V played a pivotal role in organizing the Holy League, rallying support from various European powers. To be continued next week...

Theme: The Evil of Attachment

28th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year B, October 13, 2024

First Reading: Wisdom 7:7-11, Second Reading: Hebrews 4:12-13,, Gospel: Mark 10:17-30

The first reading from the book of Wisdom reflects on how the prayer for the gift of wisdom was granted. "I prayed, and prudence was given to me, I pleaded, and the spirit of Wisdom came to me". Wisdom is personified as female and a value to seek after because she is at the center of every other gift. The reading exalts all to seek for wisdom and the best place to get this gift is in prayer. When Solomon was asked by God to make only a single request, he prayed for wisdom of God because with the gift of wisdom we understand how to do God's will. In the second reading from the letter to the Hebrews, the word of God is described as sharper than any double-edged sword. The metaphor of the double-edged sword used in describing the word of God exemplifies the effect and power the word of God has. Its power rests on how it accomplishes tasks beyond imagination. The Word of God accomplishes such because it is Jesus Himself who is the word of God.

The Gospel presents us with the encounter between Jesus and a young rich man who approached Jesus with a question on what he must do to gain eternal life. Jesus takes him through the commandments and the young man was very faithful in his observance of them. Having manifested a good obedience to the commandments Jesus demanded of him to go a step further to sell all he has and give to the poor. That was when the man left Jesus with sadness in his face. At the first reading one would think Jesus was condemning wealth and riches but that is not the message Jesus conveys to His audience. The central message Jesus gives, is the evil nature of strong attachment to things.

The young man's face fell as we read in the Gospel not because he was rich but because he was so attached to his possessions that he cannot let go. Attachments block our mind, heart and spirit so that there is no space for God or our fellow human being in our lives. It can be attachment to ambition, power, positions, or relationships, wealth and possessions. It is hard to listen to God's call once there is a strong attachment of any sort. Undue attachment displaces the place of God in our lives and takes up the position God would have taken making what we are attached to a little god in us. Jesus calls for a thorough examination of what has displaced Him in our lives.

Jesus wants us to stand bare before the God who is good, with the radical trust in God's gifts. This is the way to eternal life for which this the man and all of us desire at the end of our lives. However, it is only through the gift of wisdom that one may realize that nothing lasts forever except a relationship with God. Wisdom as was presented in the first reading helps us to seek for the things of heaven where there is lasting happiness. Without the insight of wisdom, it is possible to feel that life consists only of power, possessions, unruly ambitions, relationships one has or wealth. The demand of Jesus is that we rid ourselves of any attachments that take the place of God in our lives. Jesus assures all who detach for the sake of the Gospel reward here on earth and the world to come. Let us seek for the wisdom of God that would guide and direct our lives towards God.

The Director of Liturgy and Music is responsible for developing, planning, coordinating, and directing all liturgical celebrations and music ministries. Liturgical Planning duties include planning, organizing, and executing all liturgical celebrations, including but not limited to weekend Masses, feast days, Holy Week, Advent, Christmas, Easter, and other special liturgies. Will collaborate with the clergy and liturgical teams to ensure cohesive and spiritually enriching liturgies. Coordinate schedules for lectors, Eucharistic ministers, altar servers, and other liturgical ministries.

Music Ministry includes selecting appropriate music for all liturgical services, ensuring alignment with liturgical seasons, readings, and themes. Will recruit, train, and direct choir members, cantors, and musicians for various Masses and special occasions. Includes preparing music ministers for rehearsals and performances, ensuring quality and liturgical appropriateness. Will lead the congregation in musical worship, encouraging active participation

Qualifications consist of a Bachelor's or Master's Degree in Liturgy, Music, Theology, or related field, proficiency in playing a musical instrument (e.g., organ, piano, or guitar) and leading vocal ensembles, strong understanding of Catholic liturgy and sacred music, experience in planning and leading liturgical celebrations, strong leadership and communication skills, with the ability to work collaboratively with clergy, staff, and volunteers, ability to manage multiple projects and meet deadlines, and commitment to fostering spiritual growth through liturgy and music.


