Pastor's Corner

Appeal for Our Air Condition Units

Beloved Parishioners,

I wish to dedicate this week's Pastor's Corner on some of our parish financial needs. The highest of them all is the situation of the church air conditioner units of which I have spoken to you in the past. However, before I go into that, I would like to thank everyone for the significant increase that has been recorded in the weekly plate collection. As many of you can see, the monthly summary indicates a significant increase which helps us to meet our monthly expenses. I say a BIG THANK YOU to all. If there are those who have not stepped up to increase their offering, this is the time you may consider adding something to what you have given in the past.

The various committees, like the Parish Council, the Building Committee with the help of the Finance Committee recently compiled a list of the various parish financial needs and the aim is to assist the parish in the effort to become more proactive in providing for our current and future needs. I would make the list available in the coming weeks so that anyone who is touched can look at the items and see where he/she can assist.

In the past few weeks, I have been sharing with you the state of our air conditioning units in our church, which are more than twenty years old and right now at the brink of total collapse. As I said in my first address to you, it is an emergency, and they need to be replaced as soon as possible. We have obtained multiple proposals from local air conditioning contractors and the lowest bid to replace both units is about one hundred and sixty thousand dollars, \$160,000.00 as opposed to the \$240,000.00, which was the initial proposal we received, that I told you about in the past. But we received a good bid that agreed to do it for us at a very discounted price. Half of the amount must be submitted when we sign the purchase order. The balance of it would be due when the installation is completed. It is estimated that the unit will be received in approximately six months. Installation will take approximately one month.

Unfortunately, we do not have adequate cash reserves to provide for this necessary expense. As a result of this situation, I am appealing to everyone as we wish us to embark on a second collection once a month which would be used specifically for this purchase. We may need to take a loan to allow us to place the order. Our hope is that the funds from the second collection will accumulate quickly to reduce the amount of interest we will need to pay on the loan. As of October 28th, the total amount we have received for the air conditioners is \$25,051.38.

I wish to thank many of you who, being aware of this need, have made significant contributions to assist us in taking care of this need. Your positive response is highly appreciated while I sincerely appeal for more support in this regard. It is not difficult to notice that our parish has other immediate financial needs which require our attention. As the second collection accumulates, part of it would be used to address some of these needs. Many areas of our parking lot are in bad shape and some of our pew kneelers are falling off, so also the stucco. As I said, with time I would make available the list of our highest priority needs of the parish so that people are free to choose which one they wish to support. Everyone will have the opportunity to decide.

Finally, I remain ever grateful to you all my beloved parishioners for your constant support in various ways for the good of the parish while I appeal that you do not get tired in your support as I know that the world economy right now is hard on everyone but with God on our side and your support we would get over it

Theme: God Does Miracles in Our Lives

31st Sunday in Ordinary Time Year B, November 3, 2024 First Reading: Deuteronomy 6:2-6, Second Reading: Hebrews 7:23-28, Gospel: Mark 12:28b-34

"Hear, O Israel: The Lord Our God, is the Lord alone. Therefore, you shall love the Lord your God, with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your strength. Take to heart these words which I enjoin on you today." These were the words of Moses to the Israelites in today's first reading from the book of Deuteronomy. It is called Jewish "shema" perhaps one of the most recited and most beloved prayers of Judaism. The prayer proclaims the oneness of God and the basis of the Jewish pure monotheism. The most amazing thing about this is that Jews proclaim this oneness of God at a time when all other countries around them embraced polytheism. For the Jews, this God demands wholehearted love and devotion above any other acts of worship. It is this absolute confidence in the oneness of God that Moses enjoins his people to have and with that their lives would be prolonged. In the same way, our observance of God's commandment guarantees our loyalty to God. When we give God true and undivided devotion and worship, we become more of what God wants us to be because we are created in His image and likeness.

The second reading presents us with Our Lord Jesus Christ who is the Eternal High Priest, our sole Mediator before God the Father and humans. His priesthood is eternal, so His one Sacrifice suffices for all time. Jesus' priesthood is different from the Levitical priests who offer sacrifices day after day for themselves and the people, but Jesus offers one single sacrifice for us when He offered Himself at the cross. Every other sacrifice we might make is subsumed in the sacrifice of Jesus on the cross. The greatest sacrifice we can offer God is our observance of His commandment which is a commandment of love to Him and for our fellow brothers and sisters. We demonstrate our appreciation for the sacrifice of Jesus for us on how we care for each other.

In today's gospel we witness another encounter between Jesus and a young scribe. In the last two weeks it was between Jesus and a young rich man, today it was with a Jewish scribe of the law. He wanted to know which of the commandments is the first and most important of all the other commandments. His quest was because of the various interpretations given by different schools of thoughts within Judaism. Moses gave them ten commandments but religious scholars, teachers and scribes in their interpretations of the law expanded it to 613 precepts while David reduced it to 11 in Psalm 15. Thus, with these different nuances there were conflicting opinions on which was the most important of the commandments.

Jesus in response to the question summarized the whole law under love of God and love of neighbor. In effect Jesus was asked for one commandment, but He gave two to demonstrate that they are inseparable. What Jesus did was to take the shema, known to every Jew, which they recite every day and carry around to include that of the neighbor. No one has ever done it except Jesus and in doing so He made the *shema* something that binds us with God and our fellow human being together. What Jesus is telling us with His response is that love is what should be at the center of every activity. When all our words and deeds are motivated by love of God and love of neighbor, we will truly be living as members of the kingdom of God. There is no way we can claim we truly love God without that love transcending to our fellow brothers and sisters. According to St. John if anyone says "I love God, and hates his brother, he is a liar for he who does not love his brother whom he has seen, cannot love God whom he has not seen." 1 Jn 4:20 If we follow the commandment of love, we will keep other commandments. Love of God is a matter of giving God our trust, our time and our obedience.

By tradition, the Catholic Church dedicates the month of November to the Holy Souls in Purgatory, those faithful Christians who have


died and gone before us but who still must atone for their sins. The time they spend in Purgatory cleanses them so that they may enter heaven free from all effects of sin.


