# Pastor's Corner

"He Sent Them Two by Two" - Retracing Our Missionary Identity

**Beloved Parishioners**,

In the last two weeks I said in all the Masses that beginning from the month of September we would embark on missionary outreach and evangelization in our parish. It is a call Jesus gives everyone of us as a Christian and Catholic to step out and invite someone to come to him. This motivates the topic for today's Pastor's Corner.

Let me ask you, what if you woke up tomorrow and heard Jesus call you by name—and send you out? No detailed map. No suitcase. Just one instruction: "Go. Bring peace where there is unrest. Bring hope where there is despair. Bring Me into the lives of others." In Luke's Gospel, Jesus does just that: "The Lord appointed seventy-two others and sent them ahead of him in pairs to every town and place he intended to visit." (Luke 10:1). This image is not just a historical account; it is a living invitation and an expression of one major character of the Church. The Church, in every age, is sent. And so are we.

Emphatically, mission is at the Heart of the Church, and our call is rooted in Baptism. The Catechism of the Catholic Church is clear: "The whole Church is missionary, and the work of evangelization is a basic duty of the People of God." (CCC 849). It continues by asserting that "By Baptism, the laity are made sharers in the priestly, prophetic, and kingly functions of Christ...they have the special vocation to make the Church present and fruitful in those places where only they can become the salt of the earth." (CCC 897–899). Pope Paul VI reiterated this in landmark encyclical his Evangelii "Evangelizing is in fact, the grace and vocation proper to the Church, her deepest identity. She exists in order to evangelize." (Evangelii Nuntiandi, 14). Each baptized person is called to embrace the missionary dimension of our faith—not as an optional extra, but as part of our very identity. Whether we are laypeople, clergy, religious, young, or elderly, the mission field is around us—in our homes, workplaces, neighborhoods, and even in the silence of our witness. Jesus sends us not necessarily to foreign lands, but to familiar hearts that hunger for kindness, truth, and peace.

Francis, emphasizing missionary spirit in Evangelii Gaudium urges us: "I dream of a 'missionary option', that is, a missionary impulse capable of transforming everything...for the evangelization of today's world rather than for her self -preservation." (Evangelii Gaudium, 27). Let us take those words seriously. It's tempting to see the Church only as a place of comfort—a haven from the storms of life. And indeed, she is. But she is also a vessel sailing outward, not inward. We are not just invited to sit in the pews but to step out of them, carrying the peace of Christ to those who feel forgotten, unseen, unloved. What this means, dear friends, is that your ordinary life—your work, your family, your acts of patience and generosity—can become holy ground, a place where Christ is made visible.

There are a few simple ways to embrace the mission. I gently offer you a few invitations this week: First, begin with prayer. Ask the Lord each morning, "Where are You sending me today? Who needs Your peace?" Second, try as much as possible to be a quiet witness, a silent preacher. Strive to bring Christ to others through your small acts of charity, patience, and faithfulness. Third, share your story. Let others know how your faith sustains you. It doesn't require eloquence—only honesty. Remember that modern man listens to witnesses more than evangelizers. Fourth, invite others in. If someone is searching or hurting, invite them to Mass, to coffee, or simply to a listening ear. This simple act will go a long way in lifting their loads. We offer coffee and donuts every Sunday after Mass for people to share with one another. Fifth, support the Church's mission through giving your time, talents, and treasure. Help the Church "go forth." Remember that some give to the missions by going while others go to the missions by giving. To be continued next Sunday.

## Theme: Courage in Conflict While Keeping Our Eyes Fixed on Jesus

20th Sunday of the Year C, August 17, 2025

First Reading: Jeremiah 38:4-6, 8-10 Second Reading: Hebrews 12:1-4, Gospel: Luke 12:49-53

The episode of today's first reading took place, about 600 years before Christ, in Babylonia which is today's Iraq. The King Nebuchadnezzar, of Babylon, conquering all the nations that surrounded Babylon. As the Babylonians attacked Jerusalem, Jeremiah one of the greatest Prophets of the time told the Jewish people that it was useless for them to defend themselves as Nebuchadnezzar would destroy Jerusalem. It is better they surrender themselves in peace or face destruction. Thus, instead of listening to Jeremiah they got angry and wanted him killed. Because of the resistance of the Jews, the Babylonians destroyed Jerusalem and that led to the Babylonian Exile.

For many years many prophets, and Jeremiah included, had been sent by God to warn the people of the punishment that will befall them if they do not repent from their evil ways especially of their exploitation of the poor lack of compassion. They never paid attention nor gave ears to the prophets.

The same Jewish leaders who opposed his prophecy were the same people who told the King that Jeremiah is unpatriotic and needs to die. They want to get rid of him. So, they got the king's permission and put him in a well cistern to die. However, he was saved through a Cushite who persuaded the king to change his mind. We learn from this event that refusal to heed the voice of God in our own lives, comes with some consequences as a result of our refusal to change when we had the opportunity. Let us appreciate those who

confront us with some truth instead of hating them.

In addition, those who are persecuted for the sake of the truth would always have God by their side. In such situation fix your eyes on Jesus. When you face challenges and difficulties in your family, you should fix your eyes on Jesus. When you face trial and temptation and you are about to give up, fix your eyes on Jesus. Because when we fix our eyes on Jesus, we see Him risen, glorified, and enthroned in the supreme power at the right hand of God the Father and he will not allow us to be defeated by the wicked hand of the enemy.

Then in the Gospel Jesus speaks of the division his presence will bring to the world. One may begin to wonder why he is talking about division when he tells us in many places that he is the prince of peace. So, when Jesus speaks of division, he is speaking of the ongoing battle between good and evil, between those who believe and follow him and those who reject him. It is Jesus' intention to offer God's forgiveness and love to all who would accept it. Division results from the facts that there will always be those who resist Jesus' offer. This is the division he talks about. This battle can go on even within us, with part of us wanting to love God and follow his ways and a part us wanting to go in the opposite direction. Let us today decide to abide in and follow him without reservation.

We are all called to be witnesses of hope because of our faith in Jesus Christ, who is with us in the world. Once you begin to live that faith, you have hope in every circumstance. Hope is "living with God in the world." Pope Benedict wrote about hope in his encyclical Spe Salve. Christ dwells within us as we witness hope to the world. That hope is nourished by Jesus' great promises of what awaits us as His faithful disciples. Jesus wants to help us to be aware of His presence which is the source of our hope. He meets us in prayer. He comes to live in us in Holy Communion. He wants to make us citizens with the saints through Holy Communion. He promises that if we remember Him and live with Him in the world, if He finds us vigilant in loving service, He will gird Himself, have them recline at table and proceed to wait on them. That is what He did at the Last Supper, taking the form of a slave and washing His apostles' feet and feeding them with His own body and blood. That is what He does for us in the Eucharistic banquet. At every Mass we come together to give everyone a reason of the hope that is within us, and at the end of every Mass we are sent out with Christ within us and with His blessing to be witnesses of this hope! HOPE DOES NOT DISAPPOINT!






