Pastor's Corner

Faith That Sees the Unseen: Walking with Abraham in Trust

Beloved Parishioners,

As we come to the end of this month my reflection in this Pastor's Corner is centered on Faith. My prayer is that God increases our faith in him that we do not doubt his power in our lives. "Faith is being sure about what we hope for, and certain about what we do not see" (Hebrews 11:1). That's not just a verse to memorize — it's the soundtrack of Abraham's life, and it's meant to be the heartbeat of ours too. Abraham left the comfort of what he knew simply because God spoke a promise to him. No road map, no photographs of the "Promised Land," just a word from God and a heart willing to trust. He walked as a stranger in foreign places, keeping his eyes on a city "with foundations, whose architect and builder is God" (Heb. 11:10). Faith, then, is not a fuzzy feeling or naïve optimism. It is a stubborn, daily decision to lean on God's promise even when the evidence in front of you shouts the opposite.

The Scripture gives us this steadying courage. The psalmist assures us that "the eyes of the Lord are on those who fear him, on those who hope in his steadfast love" (Ps. 33:18). Wisdom tells us that God protects those who cling to his word (Wis. 18:6–9). And Luke's tender line — "Do not be afraid, little flock; for it is your Father's good pleasure to give you the kingdom" (Luke 12:32) — turns our trembling into trust. But let's be clear: Abraham's greatness was not in feeling safe, but in acting as if God's word was already true.

Faith that sees the unseen will cost us something. It means refusing false securities — choosing to be a pilgrim rather than a settler. Abraham's test came in the unthinkable request

to offer Isaac, showing that his trust was in God Himself, not merely in the gift God had given. Our tests might look quieter but cut just as deep: choosing generosity over self-preservation, forgiving when it's easier to stay resentful, saying "yes" to a difficult service when hiding would be simpler, opening the door to hospitality when you'd rather keep your space to yourself.

So how do we grow this kind of faith? Start with remembering. Write down three ways God has been faithful to you recently and keep them where you'll see them — on your fridge, your dashboard, or in your prayer journal. Root yourself in Scripture and the sacraments — the Eucharist is a taste of that promised city we're headed toward. Obey the small nudges toward kindness; they train your heart for bigger leaps of trust. Practice letting go — choose one thing you're clinging to and give it away, just to prove to yourself that God, not that thing, holds your life. And walk with others on the journey — even Abraham had companions; faith is personal, but it's not solitary.

When doubt and fear creep in — and they will — remember this is not failure, this is the landscape of faith. Speak God's word back to your own heart: "Do not be afraid, little flock." Ask yourself, what am I trusting in most right now? Where has God already shown me that He is faithful? What small act of obedience today will make my trust visible?

May this be a week where you see the unseen — not by closing your eyes to reality, but by looking at reality through the eyes of God's promise. Amen.

Theme: Humility and Blessings

22nd Sunday of the Year C, August 31, 2025

First Reading: Sirach 3:17-18, 28-29, Second Reading: Hebrews 12:18-19, 22-24, Gospel: Luke 14:1, 7-14

The first reading of today comes from book of Sirach also known the Ecclesiasticus. The book is intended for those who wish to gain wisdom and instruction for life. He discusses issues like repentance, humility, family life, societal relationship, prudence and the meaning of life and death. He does not talk about what happens after life. Sirach is among the books referred to as the Wisdom Literature and are concerned with the question about the role of God in everyday life and the meaning of life. What can make one happy in life? The whole book of Wisdom Literature asks questions like, what can I do to be wise or successful? How can I be happy in life? Why am I so sad? What is the meaning of life and why do the people suffer?

The central message of today's passage is the need for humility. "My Son, perform your tasks in meekness then you will be loved more than a giver of gifts." The greater you are, the more you must humble yourself, so you will find favor with God because a humble person truly recognizes his true status and knows that his gifts, talents, and abilities as coming from God. Humility helps us to recognize our continued need of God and his mercy and forgiveness. Pride goes before destruction and hence must be kept deflated. A bit of deflation can help us at all times. A proud person makes himself the center of attraction. He or she looks down on others and always sees himself very important. A proud person finds it hard to say I am sorry, and he finds it very difficult to accept corrections.

The gospel presents us with a dinner invitation to Jesus by a Pharisee. He went to dinner to demonstrate that he came for everyone, the good, the bad and the ugly. Jesus arrives as usual, whereas the people and the Pharisees were more interested in watching him to find fault with him. To watch someone means to put one under intense scrutiny. It means to keep a close eye on one to discover where he/she makes mistakes. There is nothing more trying than to be under constant critical scrutiny. When that happens most often, we lose our focus, our nerve and even more often lose our temper. But Jesus remained serene and calm in this condition. If we live with him, he can always make us like himself when we are under pressure and critical scrutiny. When we have a humble and meek heart like Jesus, we will always remain calm and serene under any condition.

Jesus was invited by a Pharisee and not just any Pharisee but a leading member. It is like saying that he was invited to a dinner by an enemy because of his critique of the Pharisees' way of religious practices which generate a lot of conflict between Jesus and the Pharisees. He would not refuse even an enemy's invitation. This is because he knows very well that we will never make our enemies our friends if we refuse to meet and talk with them. The message Jesus teaches us is to meet and talk with those we consider not our friends or those who disagree with us. We can never win our foes over unless we meet and talk with them.


When you sit down with your family for dinner tonight, ask if you can serve the food. You may surprise your parents and get some pretty big smiles from them.
