Amos condemns the complacency of the rich who seek only their own comfort. In his parable about the rich man and Lazarus, Jesus echoes Amos, exhorting those who have to share with those who have not. Self-sufficiency must never blind us to the needs of others. Only in this way do we keep God's commandments in integrity and in truth.

Pastor's Corner

MORE TRUTH, MORE COST

Beloved Parishioners,

Everyone can testify that truth is a beautiful yet costly treasure. The Greek philosopher Plato once observed, "No one is more hated than he who speaks the truth." History and Scripture confirm this sobering reality: to stand for truth is often to stand against the tide of comfort, convenience, and compromise. Yet truth is not optional for us as Christians—for we follow Jesus who is "the Way, the Truth, and the Life" (John 14:6). And He tells us plainly: "You will know the truth, and the truth will set you free" (John 8:32).

Think for a moment of Socrates, the Greek philosopher. Surrounded by pressure to renounce his teaching, he chose instead to remain faithful to his convictions. When condemned by the Athenian court, he accepted the cup of hemlock, preferring death to betraying his conscience. His life reminds us that truth is never cheap—it carries a cost, and it calls for loyalty, even when that loyalty leads to suffering and death.

The Bible, too, gives us countless witnesses. Jeremiah, the "weeping prophet," proclaimed God's word faithfully but was beaten, thrown into a cistern, and mocked by his own people (Jeremiah 38:6). John the Baptist lost his head for confronting Herod's immorality (Mark 6:17–29). And above all, Jesus Christ Himself—"the Way, the Truth, and the Life" (John 14:6)—was crucified for proclaiming the Kingdom of God and exposing the lies of hypocrisy. Saint Paul understood this cost when he asked: "Have I now become your enemy by telling you the truth?" (Galatians 4:16). He endured beatings, imprisonment, and rejection because he refused to dilute the Gospel.

Even in our own times, the price of truth is still evident. In the American cultural landscape, many who dare to speak uncomfortable truths—whether in politics, faith, or society—face ridicule, censorship, and loss of reputation. History reminds

us of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., who gave his life for the truth of racial justice and human dignity; Rosa Parks, who endured scorn for standing on the truth of equality; and countless civil rights leaders, clergy, and believers who bore the weight of persecution for justice. The lesson is clear: truth demands courage. But as Christians, we cannot remain silent. Jesus prayed to the Father: "Sanctify them in the truth; your word is truth" (John 17:17). We are not called to invent truth but to live it and bear witness to it—whether in our families, workplaces, parishes, or communities.

Though the cost of truth is high, its reward is eternal. Jesus promised: "Blessed are you when people insult you, persecute you and falsely say all kinds of evil against you because of me. Rejoice and be glad, for great is your reward in heaven" (Matthew 5:11–12).

Dear friends, America today needs Christians unafraid of the price tag attached to truth. Our nation longs for men and women willing to resist false peace, easy lies, and the comfort of self-preservation. As Saint Augustine reminds us in *Civitas Dei*, we do not live for the City of Man, built on self-interest, but for the City of God, built on self-giving love.

So let us persevere. Speak the truth with courage, but also with charity. Stand firm—not with arrogance, but with the humility of Christ who bore the cross. For in the end, truth never loses. Lies may dominate for a season, but truth belongs to God, and God always has the final word.

May the Spirit strengthen us to echo the words of Saint Paul: "We cannot do anything against the truth, but only for the truth" (2 Corinthians 13:8). And may our lives testify that while truth is costly, it is also liberating, life-giving, and worth every sacrifice.

Theme: To Place God Above All Our Possessions

26th Sunday of the Year C, September 28, 2025

First Reading: Amos 6:1a, 4-7, Second Reading: 1 Timothy 6:11-16, Gospel: Luke 16:19-31

Listening to the harsh words of the Prophet Amos directed against the rich and wealthy in the first reading and the condemnation of the rich man to hell in today's Gospel, one may think that God is against the rich or that the wealthy are cut off from the kingdom of God. But such an idea is far from the truth. After all, we are told in (I Samuel 2:7 "The Lord makes poor and makes rich, he brings low and, he also exalts"), (I Chronicles 29:12 says, "Both riches and honor come from God, and you rule over all."), (Ecclesiastes 5:19 says, "Every man also to whom God has given wealth and possession and power to enjoy them, and to accept his lots and find enjoyment in his toil this is the gift of God.") Therefore, since both wealth and riches come from God, he is not against riches or those who possess wealth but rather he is against those who have abandoned God because of their wealth, those who exploit others and those who treat others with contempt and indifference, and those who show no care and attention towards the needy and especially of their own community.

It is these evils that the Prophet Amos who carried out his prophetic mission around 760bc in the Northern Kingdom of Israel condemns among the people of his time. At that time there was economic prosperity which produced a very wealthy class of merchants and rulers who felt much secure in their wealth. As such, their wealth made them complacent, had no place for God in their lives and indifference towards the needy around them. At that time, as their

economy grew and prospered there was no thought given to the moral responsibility which each person should have towards their neighbor. It is against this background that Amos tells the wealthy individuals of the society that they will go to hell.

The same message is seen in the Gospel of today. In the parable, Jesus tells the story of a rich man and poor Lazarus. The rich man has no name but feasted and enjoyed his wealth without caring for poor Lazarus who stands at his door. The rich man was not punished because of his wealth nor was he condemned to hell because he was rich. He suffers the pain of hell because he could not see beyond his material wealth and possession. "Jesus is condemning the callousness of those who live lives of self-indulgence while ignoring the needs of the poor, especially the poor of their own community or their own community of faith." In the end the rich man became a beggar.

On the other hand, poor Lazarus did not go to heaven because he was poor. It is not his poverty nature that gained him a place among the saints and angels in heaven. It was because he trusted in God. That corresponds to the meaning of his name Lazarus "God is my Help." Despite a life of misfortune and suffering, Lazarus did not lose hope and trust in God. His eyes were set on a treasure stored up for him in heaven.

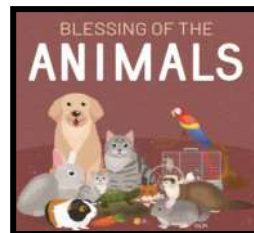

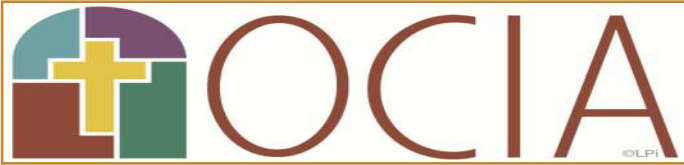

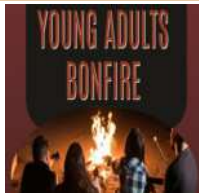

The 2025 Jubilee is intrinsically linked with evangelization as a time for personal and communal spiritual renewal. The Church emphasizes this as a year of grace, forgiveness, and hope and an opportunity to bring the “joyful proclamation of the Gospel to everyone.” Evangelization is a call to hope and mercy. Pope Francis organized the Jubilee as a response to global suffering, calling on Catholics to restore a climate of hope in a world impacted by war, poverty, and other crises. He asserts that evangelizing with “the anointment and style of mercy” opens hearts more willingly to conversion. He appointed the “Missionaries of Mercy” to serve during the Jubilee and to be signs of God’s forgiveness. He called for a renewed evangelistic approach that emphasizes a spirit of mercy to counteract secularism. While Holy Doors were opened in Rome and other designated places worldwide, the Lord Jesus is the “door” of hope, which is central to the evangelization mission. That is another reason for us to remember, **HOPE DOES NOT**
