# Pastor's Corner

#### JESUS CHRIST – TRUE GOD AND TRUE MAN

**Beloved Parishioners.** 

Today in this forum my intention is to touch on one of the doctrines of our faith, Jesus Christ true God, and true man. In the Nicene-Constantinopolitan Creed, which we profess at Mass, there is a section on the Son that I want us to meditatively reflect on and it reads: "I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through him all things were made. For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven, and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary and became man."

Whenever we profess this, we affirm that Jesus is both fully divine ("true God from true God") and fully human ("became man"). This fullness of divinity and humanity comes together in one singular event, the Incarnation.

The mystery of the Incarnation lies at the very heart of Christianity. The Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC 464) teaches: "The unique and altogether singular event of the Incarnation of the Son of God does not mean that Jesus Christ is partly God and partly man, nor does it imply that He is the result of a confused mixture of the divine and the human. He became truly man while remaining truly God." This central belief—that Jesus is both fully divine and fully human—distinguishes Christianity and anchors our hope. Scripture proclaims this truth with striking clarity. John writes: "And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us" (John 1:14). The eternal Logos, who "was with God and was God" (John 1:1), chose to enter fully into our human story.

Yet, the Church did not arrive at this understanding without struggle. Early heresies distorted the mystery of Christ. Docetism claimed that Jesus only seemed human, denying His real flesh and suffering. Arianism argued that Jesus was a creature—greater than humans, but less than God. Nestorianism divided Christ into two persons, one divine and one human. Monophysitism collapsed His divinity and humanity into a single confused nature. In response, the Church, guided by the Holy Spirit, clarified the truth at the

Councils of Nicaea (325), Constantinople (381), Ephesus (431), and Chalcedon (451). The Chalcedonian definition remains foundational: Jesus Christ is "one Person in two natures, without confusion, change, division, or separation." The Catechism (CCC 465–478) summarizes this: Jesus is consubstantial with the Father in His divinity, consubstantial with us in His humanity, like us in all things but sin.

Why does this matter? Because the Incarnation is not an abstract puzzle—it is the center of our salvation. If Jesus were not truly God, He could not save us. If He were not truly man, He could not represent us. As Saint Athanasius taught, "What has not been assumed has not been redeemed." In Jesus, God comes close—Emmanuel, "God with us" (Matthew 1:23). He knows the fatigue of labor, the ache of sorrow, the sting of rejection, and even the silence of death. Because He is truly human, He shares our struggles. Because He is truly divine, He brings healing, forgiveness, and eternal life.

This doctrine carries deep pastoral meaning. When you are tired, remember Christ who sat weary at the well (John 4:6). When you grieve, recall Jesus weeping at Lazarus' tomb (John 11:35). When you suffer injustice, think of the One mocked and condemned though innocent. When you feel abandoned, remember that Jesus cried out, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" (Matthew 27:46). His humanity is not a disguise—it is God entering fully into our lives. And because He is divine, He transforms human weakness into the pathway of resurrection.

The mystery of Christ as True God and True Man is at once the foundation of our hope, the assurance of God's love, and the model for our discipleship. The Catechism (CCC 478) reminds us that the Sacred Heart of Jesus symbolizes that divine-human love which embraces us all. Let us therefore hold fast to the mystery of the Incarnation: Jesus, fully God and fully man, Emmanuel—God with us. In Him, heaven and earth meet; in Him, our struggles are redeemed; and in Him, our destiny is secure.

#### Theme: Faith Key to Removing Obstacles and Difficulties

27th Sunday of the Year C, October 5, 2025

First Reading: Habakkuk 1:2-3, 2:2-4, Second Reading: 2 Timothy 1:6-8, 13-14, Gospel: Luke 17:5-10

The Liturgy of today presents us with the issue of faith. In the first reading from the Prophet Habakkuk, it says "the righteous shall live by faith" while in the Gospel the apostles asked the Lord to increase their faith. And in response Jesus told them "If you had faith as a grain of mustard seed you can say to this mulberry tree be rooted up, and be planted in the sea, and it would obey you."

The question is what is faith? How can we grow in faith? Hebrews 11:1 says, "Faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen." and Hebrews 11:11, says "By Faith Sarah herself received power to conceive, even when she was passed the age, since she considered him faithful who had promised." In Vs 28 "By Faith the people crossed the Red Sea as if on dry land." When God reveals himself to us, he gives assurance and conviction that his power and presence and glory is just as real, even more real than our experience of the natural physical world around us. Things around us can change but God never changes. He is constantly ever true to his word, always faithful to his promises. God is ever faithful, reliable and dependable.

Habakkuk had his prophesy around 610 -600bc. It was during the reign of Josiah who was the grandson of Manasseh. Josiah had proved to be a good king unlike his grandfather who was evil. Josiah inaugurated a reform of the worship of the true God. He suppressed the activities of the worship of the lesser shrines throughout the land, where idolatrous practices were entrenched. The temple itself was purified and rededicated, and the people were encouraged to worship God joyfully with singleness of heart. There

was peace and progress in the land and a true worship of God flourished in the land.

It was during these great reforms for true worship of God initiated by King Josiah that he was killed by the Babylonians, a pagan nation ruled by a pagan king. They could not understand this reversal of events. Men and women began to probe their hearts to find answers to their searching questions. How could God allow such a terrible thing to happen? If the reformation ideals of good king Josiah had been correct, God should have allowed the king and the nation to prosper. Instead, the king had been killed, and the nation had been subjected to new foreigner masters. Why should the wicked Babylonian whose evil was well known triumph the good and God-fearing King Josiah? It is because of this that the Prophet cries out, "How long, O Lord I cry for help, but you do not listen. I cry out to you Violence."

The answer comes to Habakkuk in a vision, Habakkuk 2:2 "And the Lord answered, "write the vision, make it plain upon tablet, the just one because of his faith shall live." Those who love God must exercise patience. Patience is one way in which our Faith in God is tested, therefore we need patience to experience this special favor of God especially in times of troubles and crisis. God's ways are true, despite the terrible nature of the present circumstance. God is still in control of this world. We are called to have total faith in God despite the apparent challenges we face in life.







# UN PLAN ESPIRITUAL PARTE 1

To experience the grace of the Jubilee, the message outlines a path of spiritual renewal. We renew ourselves by:

#### • Prayer and Sacraments

This is an intense year of prayer and frequent reception of the Sacrament of Reconciliation which is encouraged to receive God's forgiveness and grace.

Corporal Works of Mercy

Pilgrims are urged to engage in acts of mercy, such as feeding the hungry or comforting the sorrowful. Volunteer at the Soup Kitchen at Columban Hall, donate food or funds to the Soup Kitchen, offer meals or groceries to someone you know is in need.

Pilgrimage

Making a pilgrimage to the designated holy sites to pass through a Holy door symbolizes a deeper relationship with Christ.

- Chapel of the Holy Cross in Sedona
- Sacred Heart in Prescott
- St. Anthony in Sacaton
- St. Mary in Kingman
- St. Mary's Basilica in Phoenix
- Ss. Simon and Jude Cathedral in Phoenix A plenary indulgence is given under certain and defined conditions:
- must be baptized, not excommunicated, and in the state of grace at the end of the prescribed works
- must receive sacramental confession several days before or after visiting the Jubilee Site
- should receive Eucharistic Communion on the same day as the visit, however this may be fulfilled several days before or after the visit
- should pray for the intention of the Pope on the same day as the visit, but may be fulfilled several days before or after the visit. This condition is fully satisfied by reciting one Our Father and one Hail Mary for his intentions.




