

Pastor's Corner

BAPTISM: OUR CONSECRATION TO PRAYER

Have you ever considered that your baptism was not just a ceremony, but a consecration—a setting apart for something sacred?

Beloved Parishioners,

I wish to draw our hearts to this powerful truth, namely: that we are a people consecrated to prayer. And this consecration began the day we were plunged into the waters of Baptism. Through Baptism, we were not just washed of original sin—we were adopted into God's family, united with Christ in His death and resurrection (Colossians 2:12–14), and clothed with the dignity of the firstborn sons and daughters in Christ Jesus.

As baptized members of the Body of Christ, we have the right and privilege to stand in intercession—not only for ourselves but for our families, our parish, our nation, and the world. St. John Chrysostom once said: "The power of prayer has overcome enemies, extinguished wars, appeased God... it has bridled the fury of lions, silenced storms, and conquered demons." How humbling it is that we, like Abraham, are entrusted with such divine access.

But let's be honest: sometimes we forget or even neglect this important gift. Life is busy—between work, family, school ties, traffic, and daily stress, prayer can feel far away. And yet, St. Alphonsus Liguori reminds us: "Those who pray are certainly saved; those who do not pray are certainly lost." Prayer is not about fancy words. It's about the heart. It's about showing up—just like we call a loved one to stay connected, we are called to speak to our Father every day. As God's beloved children, we are called to speak to Him intimately, to bring our needs before Him, and to remain in constant union. It follows that prayer for us, is not optional—it is our very breath as Christians. It is what sustains us in grace. And remember prayer is not always about words. Sometimes it is silence. Sometimes it is tears. Sometimes, it's simply lighting a candle and sitting with God. As St. Teresa of Avila said, "Prayer is nothing but a friendly conversation

with the One we know loves us."

We must constantly be aware that prayer is powerful, but it can be hindered. God is always ready to hear us. "The Lord's hand is not too short to save, nor his ear too dull to hear," says Isaiah 59:1. But the next verse warns us: "Your iniquities have been barriers between you and your God." (Isaiah 59:2). Sin closes the ears of our heart. It creates a chasm that weakens our communion with God. When we gossip, hold grudges, or live in selfishness, our prayers begin to feel empty. This teaches us that as baptized sons and daughters, we must strive for holiness—not out of fear, but because we love the One who first loved us. That's why we must return often to confession—to clear the channel, so to speak, and come back to prayer with clean hearts.

What privilege we have that Jesus himself teaches us how to pray. In Luke 11: 1–13, Jesus gives us the Our Father—not just as a formula, but as a school of prayer. We learn to call God Abba, Father. What a privilege! Through Baptism, the Spirit within us cries out, "Abba, Father!" (Romans 8:15). We no longer approach God as beggars, but as beloved children. Jesus also reminds us of God's generosity: "Ask and you will receive... how much more will the heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him!" (Luke 11:9,13). Let us, then, ask boldly, seek diligently, and knock persistently.

Dear brothers and sisters, Baptism made us more than churchgoers. It consecrated us people of prayer. Whether you're a student preparing for exams, a mother cooking for her family, or an elder sitting quietly with your Rosary, you are consecrated to prayer. Jesus said, "We ought always to pray and not lose heart." (Luke 18:1). In a world of troubles—be it economic hardship, insecurity, or loneliness—prayer is where we find our strength. And may the Blessed Virgin Mary, our Mother in faith, who pondered and prayed in all things, teach us to pray with her same trust and surrender. Amen.

Theme: The Family a Home Where God's Grace Dwells

Feast of the Holy Family Year A, December 28, 2025

First Reading: Sirach 3:2-6, 12-14, Second Reading: Colossians 3:12-21, Gospel: Matthew 2:13-15,19-23

The summary of the message of the first reading is the honor and respect children are obligated to give to their parents. The amazing thing is that this honor to parents when practiced with love goes with lots of blessings as stated in the reading. Thus, the author of the book of Sirach enumerates these blessings to include:

- 1) They will earn great favor of God
- 2) Their prayers would always be listened to
- 3) They would enjoy a long life and be happy with children of their own
- 4) Even if they sinned, they would be forgiven

In the second reading, Paul encourages us to put on certain virtues as our cloth. These virtues are compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, patience, forbearance, and forgiveness. As such, love and peace reign in a family where these virtues are practiced by each member of the family. The gospel presents us with Jesus' presentation in the temple by his parents. The prophecies of Simeon and Anna at that time give credence to the prophetic mission of Jesus. Their prophecies give hope to what Jesus comes to achieve for humanity but not without cross and pain for Joseph and Mary and more especially for Mary the Mother. It gives us an idea of the cross every parent goes through in raising their children. There is no family no matter how holy, lovable, rich, or poor, that is insulated from problems and difficulties of family life.

However, just as Joseph and Mary found strength in the word of God to navigate through

their problems, in the same way we can get through our own problems in our families if we hold firm to the word of God. Any family that allows God to be at the center of their marriage and family life will always be guided wisely despite the tragic situations they find themselves. No matter the love that exists between couples without strong recourse to God and prayers the vicissitudes of daily lives can always crack that love.

Dr. Paul Kelly an orthopedic surgeon and family counselor talks of the 7 "C's" that every family should imbibe to go through the storms of marriage and family life. The first C Commitment: a lifelong caring for the other and every member of the family. The second C, Communication: a willingness to take time to listen and dialogue and share one's feelings. The third C, Compatibility: ability to get along, adjust and be flexible. The fourth C is Compassion: a capacity to understand weakness and sympathize with failures. The fifth C is Confession: the readiness to say I am sorry to be reconciled and be forgiven. The sixth C is Conviviality: a sense of humor to laugh, smile and put a little joke, laugh at oneself, and make others laugh. The final C Children: they are special gifts from God. But to realize that one thing that children wear faster than shoes is parents.

I wish all of you and your families God's peace, blessing and love as we celebrate today's feast.






Mary's Kitchen



Our Lady of the Lake will formally close our Jubilee Year during the Masses on January 3 and 4, 2026. We will then turn our attention to the TILMA Project which was started last year by the Diocese of Phoenix to get ready for the 500th anniversary of Our Lady of Guadalupe. While we did try to bring that in during this past year, we will have a true focus on it for the next six years. More information to come later.
