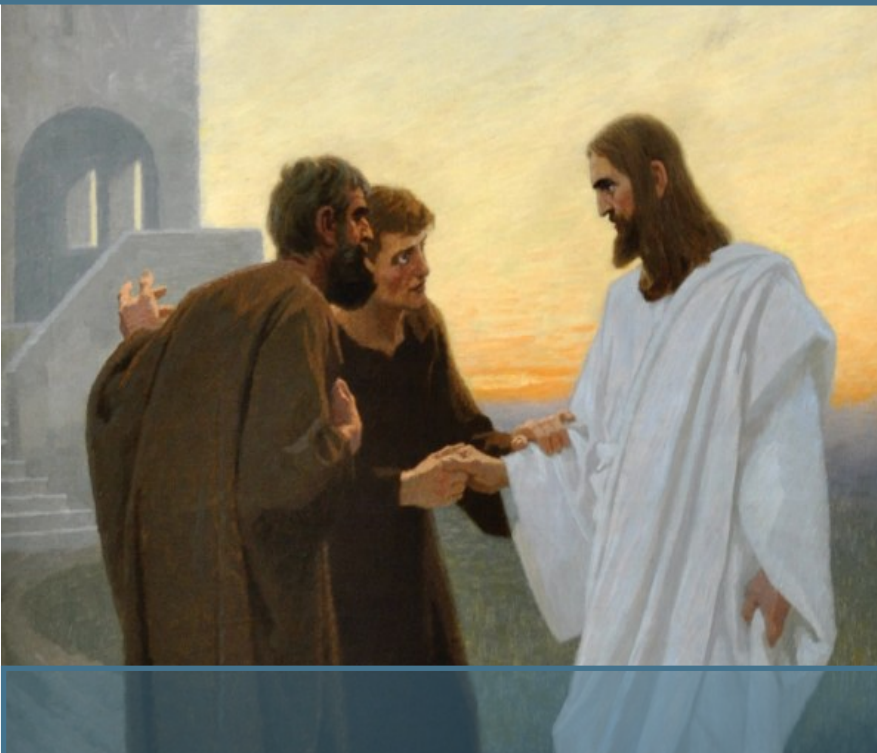

Pastor's Corner

HOPE IN DIFFICULT TIMES

Beloved Parishioners,

May the joy and peace of the risen Lord inundate our hearts and lighten up our ways! Since Easter we have been confronted with all kinds of war cries from different parts of the world that at times some of us tend to lose hope in the message of Easter that the risen Christ has come to revive our hope that Jesus is alive. It seems to me like a practical message that we should never lose sight of hope regardless of what the condition is, and this message is reinforced by the risen Lord through his resurrection.

We must be sure of this: hope is not optimism or naivety but a theological virtue that orients us to trust God's fidelity and enables to live morally. It is the quiet strength that rises when everything else seems to fall away and is ultimately the product of our faith and trust in God. It's not loud or showy — often, it's a whisper in the dark, a flicker in the heart, the stubborn refusal to give in to the temptations of despair. In difficult times, when fear and uncertainty cloud the path ahead, hope becomes both an anchor and a compass. It grounds us in something deeper than circumstance, and it points us toward something greater than what we see, the assurance of Christ.

One character with which we can distinguish hope is that it does not deny the weight of suffering. It does not ignore the pain, loss, or confusion that life often brings. Instead, it walks with us through the valley, reminding us that this moment is not the end of the story. Hope sees the cross and still believes in resurrection. It knows that, even in silence, God is near. In times of sickness, grief, or global unrest, hope asks us to trust — not in outcomes we can control, but in a God who is faithful,

even in the storm. This is why Paul counsels us when he writes in Romans 5:3-5 that “We rejoice in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces endurance, and endurance produces character, and character produces hope, and hope does not put us to shame.” We hope because we are loved. We hope because mercy is greater than judgment. We hope because Christ has gone before us — and He is risen.

When we decide to consider it with regard our eschatological hope, one beautiful assurance the resurrection of Christ has for us Christians is that death shall not have the last word. We are going to rise in glory like Christ, and we shall be with him in the same way we died with him at Baptism. My beloved parishioners, let us never lose hope despite the war cries going around globally; let us realize that our Risen Lord is alive and is Real.

Finally, the celebration of the resurrection of Christ in Easter reminds us that hope is born precisely in the shadow of death. The empty tomb is the ultimate sign that even the gravest suffering and loss does not have the final word and so we are called to be witnesses of this hope — not just in celebration but in our response to despair around us. It dares us to live out the joys of resurrection. This is why we joyfully recall the words of Peter in 1 Peter 1:3, when he says, “Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! In his great mercy he has given us new birth into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead.”

Theme: Stay with Us Jesus

Easter Sunday Year A, April 19, 2026

First Reading Acts 2:14, 22-33, Second Reading 1 Peter 1:17-21, Gospel Luke 24:13-35

Peter, in the first reading of today, stood up and proclaimed to the Jews how they used lawless men to condemn and crucify Jesus whom God commended to them, a man filled with mighty deeds and powers. He put it to them that they know how Jesus worked miracles in their midst and did many wonders but even though they killed him out of wickedness that God raised him up on the last day. The speech of Peter, in this first reading, testifies to the power of the risen Lord. This is the same Peter who could not stand before a teenage girl now speaks directly to the leaders of the religious authority, even blaming them for killing Jesus to their faces with boldness. What it means is that the power of the risen Lord had transformed him in such a way that he speaks boldly without fear. When we allow the risen Lord to transform our lives we have nothing to fear because having conquered death there is nothing more to worry about. As we celebrate this power of the risen Lord let us recognize that His power transforms situations, events and lives that He touches.

The same transforming power of the risen Lord is what we encounter in the Gospel reading. The two disciples on the road to Emmaus were disappointed, discouraged, depressed as all their hope came to nothing when Jesus was crucified on the Cross. The crucifixion shattered all their hopes, and never did they recall all that Jesus had told them that

He would rise again. As such, they decided to leave Jerusalem since there was nothing more to hope for. They were so disappointed that when Jesus joined them, they could not recognize Him. However, with the encounter of Jesus everything came back to life again. Their hopes were restored; their joy came back that they had to return back to Jerusalem to share the testimony of their faith.

According to Living Liturgy, "Emmaus is the place of conversion, of broken people healed by the broken word and the broken bread. Wounded hearts have become burning hearts, disfigured dreams are transfigured, and death is recognized as the way to invincible life." At times we are on our own road to Emmaus when we feel our dreams, our hopes and our lives are broken but allowing Jesus to walk with us on this road will surely restore the hope, the broken lives and the shattered dreams.

Finally, Emmaus challenges us to walk through our daily lives in the company of the Christ who reveals himself in Scripture and Eucharist, and in the other unexpected strangers whom we may meet and who share with us the bread of their lives that proclaim hope in the face of suffering and apparent hopelessness.

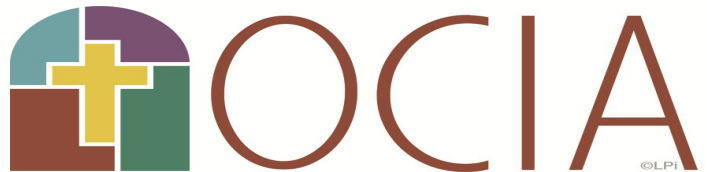

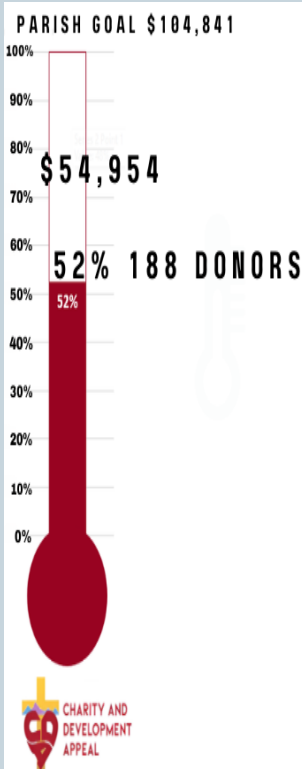

BISHOP DOLAN'S TILMA PLAN
THE FIRST APPARITION

Without any doubt, the most glorious and transcendent event in Mexico's history is that of the Apparitions of Our Lady of Guadalupe. The first Apparition took place in December of the year 1531. It happened that a poor Indian, Juan Diego by name, went to hear Mass in honor of the Virgin Mary. Dawn broke over the Tepeyac hills, and on passing by he heard music, like the chirping of many precious birds, and he stopped to listen. He was looking eastwards, above the ridge, from where the precious heavenly chant came and, just as it suddenly ceased and silence fell, he heard a voice calling him from above the ridge, saying: "Little Juan, Juan Dieguito." Juan Diego was bold enough to go up to where he was called. When he reached the top, he saw a Lady of singular beauty, standing there and telling him to come close. Juan Diego bowed before her and heard her very gentle and courteous words, as of one who draws and esteems greatly. She told him: "Little Juan, littlest of my children, where do you go?" The Virgin then spoke to him and made known Her holy will, saying: "Know and be assured, you, the littlest of my children, that I am the Ever-Virgin Holy Mary, Mother of the True God, by whom you live, Lord of Heaven and earth. It is my lively desire that a Sanctuary be built here for me to show and give all my love, compassion, and help, for I am your merciful Mother; yours, and of all you dwellers on this earth together. And to carry out the purpose of my clemency, go to the palace of the Bishop of Mexico, and you will tell him how I am sending you to show him what I so desire, that here on the level ground he build me a Sanctuary; and you will tell him attentively all you have seen and admired, and what you have heard. At once he bowed before Her and said: "My Lady, I shall go and fulfill Your charge; I bid You farewell for now, I, Your humble servant." He then went straight down to do her bidding.



PLAN DE LA TILMA DEL OBISPO DOLAN
LA PRIMERA APARICIÓN

Sin ninguna duda, el evento más glorioso y trascendente en la historia de México es el de las Apariciones de Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe. La primera Aparición tuvo lugar en diciembre del año 1531. Sucedió que un pobre indígena, llamado Juan Diego, fue a escuchar la Misa en honor a la Virgen María. El amanecer se alzó sobre los cerros del Tepeyac, y al pasar, escuchó música, como el canto de muchos pájaros preciosos, y se detuvo a escuchar. Miraba hacia el este, sobre la loma de donde venía el precioso canto celestial y, justo cuando de repente cesó y cayó el silencio, escuchó una voz llamándolo desde lo alto de la loma, diciendo: "Pequeño Juan, Juan Dieguito." Juan Diego tuvo el valor de subir hacia donde lo llamaban. Cuando llegó a la cima, vio a una Señora de singular belleza, de pie allí, diciéndole que se acercara. Juan Diego se inclinó ante ella y escuchó sus palabras muy suaves y corteses, como de alguien que atrae y estima enormemente. Ella le dijo: "Pequeño Juan, el más pequeño de mis hijos, ¿a dónde vas?" Entonces la Virgen le habló y le dio a conocer Su santa voluntad, diciendo: "Sabe y ten por seguro, tú, el más pequeño de mis hijos, que Yo soy la Siempre Virgen Santa María, Madre del Verdadero Dios, por quien vives, Señor del Cielo y de la tierra. Es mi vivo deseo que se construya aquí un Santuario para que yo muestre y otorgue todo mi amor, compasión y ayuda, pues soy tu Madre misericordiosa; tuya, y de todos los que habitan en esta tierra. Y para cumplir el propósito de mi clemencia, ve al palacio del Obispo de México, y le dirás cómo Yo te envío para mostrarle lo que tanto deseo, que aquí, en terreno llano, me construya un Santuario; y le contarás atentamente todo lo que has visto y admirado, y lo que has oído. Inmediatamente él se inclinó ante Ella y dijo: "Mi Señora, iré y cumpliré Su encargo; me despido de Usted por ahora, yo, Su humilde siervo." Luego bajó directamente para llevar a cabo Su mandato.
