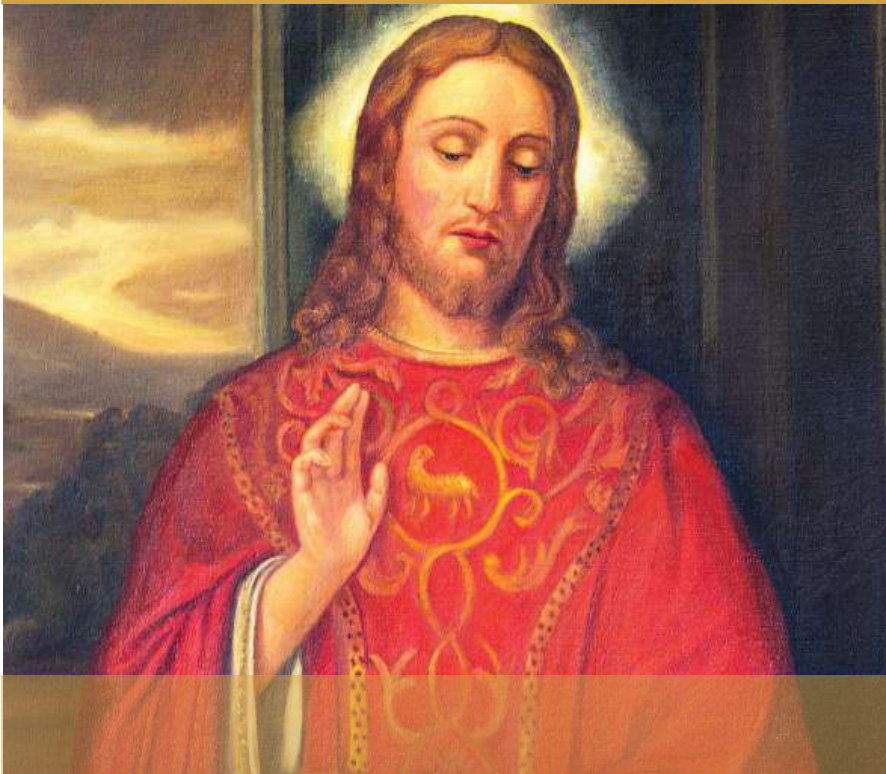

The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

June 7, 2026

The cup we share, is it not the blood of Christ? And the bread we break, is it not his body? Just as God fed the Israelites with manna from heaven, so too do we feed on the best of wheat, the bread of angels, food for the pilgrim journey.

Pastor's Corner

THIS IS MY BODY AND BLOOD GIVEN FOR YOU

Beloved Parishioners,

Happy Corpus Christi. The solemn feast of Corpus Christi is the Church's radiant hymn of love for the Eucharist; the sacred mystery where heaven stoops low to feed the hunger of humanity. In a world where many souls wander like travelers in a desert, Christ becomes the living Bread and Blood, broken and poured out for the life of the world. The Holy Eucharist is not just a sacred reminder of Jesus' union with his apostles; it is his real presence, his love stretched wide like arms upon the cross, embracing everyone. I invite you to see the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ as a hidden treasure buried beneath ordinary appearance yet today revealing an infinite glory under the form of bread and wine. We are invited once more to share in love because bread shared in love never diminishes.

From the book of Deuteronomy 8:2-3, 14a-16a we see the deep mystery and striking tenderness of the Eucharist as heaven's provision for weary pilgrims today. In the first letter of Saint Paul to the Corinthians (10:16-17), we are equally reminded of the sacred bond of unity that the Eucharist provides. Then, in the Gospel of John 6:51-58, Christ presents himself as the living bread that came down from heaven offering himself for us. He is the compassionate shepherd who refuses to send the hungry away empty. Like rain falling upon cracked earth, Jesus feeds the crowd abundantly, showing that divine grace always overflows human need. This is a point of recount for us to always remember the poor and

hungry among us, especially in moments of crisis. We should never forget that our God does many immeasurable things for the kind-hearted; one who knows the need of others.

The teaching of Saint Thomas Aquinas on the "Doctrine of Transubstantiation" is a source of strengthening on our faith in Christ. For Aquinas, although the appearance of bread and wine remain, their substance truly becomes the Body and Blood of Christ. Thus, the altar becomes both table and sacrifice, banquet and Calvary mysteriously joined together. The Eucharist is not mere spiritual decoration but heaven's medicine for wounded hearts. We are encouraged to long daily for the Body and Blood that last forever. When we long for this, we shall become what we consume, becoming *imago Dei* and *capax Dei*.

Let us not forget the words of Pope Francis in his 2021 Corpus Christi homily, where he reminds us that in the Eucharist Christ makes himself bread broken for others and asks us to give ourselves for another. So, I encourage you to remember that our faith cannot remain locked inside church walls like a lamp hidden under a basket. As those nourished by Christ, we must become bread for the poor, hope for the weary, and love for the marginalized. I pray that every Eucharistic procession may silently proclaim that Christ still walks through the rough roads of human suffering, feeding hearts that ache for a love that never fades, Amen.

Theme: The Eucharistic Food for the Journey

Corpus Christi, Year A, June 7, 2026

First Reading Deuteronomy 8:2-3, 14b-16a, Second Reading 1 Corinthians 10:16-17, Gospel John 6:51-58

The first reading from the book of Deuteronomy recalls the feeding of the Israelites in the desert with manna from heaven. The miracle of manna from heaven is a reminder that we are all on a journey and need food to sustain us in our own pilgrimage. The miracle of manna is equally a testimony of how we need to be satisfied by the heavenly food. God's action towards the people demonstrates how God cares for his people in times of need.

Paul in the second reading makes the point of how we are united in one love of celebration. "Paul explains Corpus Christi in the sense of the 'body of Christ' – the Church, the body politic, us. We are one in Christ; we all belong to the same body. In the early church, the Eucharist was celebrated as a sign that in Christ, all are equal. The very fact of coming together is the cementing of our oneness through Christ. That early Eucharist in Corinth was in grave danger of separating along social and class lines; the failure of one group to discern that the other was just as much part of the one body." For us, therefore according to Cardinal Bo, the warning is: Nothing less than a wholehearted commitment to the life and the unity of our particular community is essential to the integrity of our communion, our holy communion. Have I failed to make peace with my fellow communicant before I approach the altar? Am I indifferent to the hunger and thirst

of the millions even as I eat and drink the sacrament? If the answer is yes, then perhaps I eat and drink judgment upon myself, and Incarnate Love is betrayed at this table just as he was at the first in that upper room. This counsel from our reverend Cardinal should be taken seriously by each of us, especially today as we celebrate Corpus Christi.

The gospel presents us with Jesus' teaching on his body as the real food and his blood the real drink and whoever eats this will live forever. It is out of love for our humanity that Jesus established this great Sacrament on Holy Thursday for us and instructs us to do it in his memory. At first the idea of Jesus giving his body as food was difficult for the disciples to comprehend but Jesus insisted that it is only through this participation in this sacrament can we be saved. Till date there are still some doubts in the minds of some people that the Eucharist we receive each day is truly the body of Christ. Today's feast is meant to help us understand that the Eucharist is truly the body of Christ given to us in love. The reason for bringing out a particular Sunday to celebrate the summit of our faith is to help us grasp the meaning of what we celebrate and receive at each Mass. My prayer is that we realize that it truly is the body of Christ we receive and give and accord it the respect and value it deserves. Happy Corpus Christi.

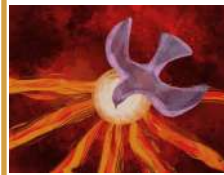

I Am Fr. Bazia Boro Elario Zambakari



I was born in South Sudan during a time of great struggle and uncertainty. Growing up during the Second Sudanese Civil War was not easy, especially for many South Sudanese Christians and Catholics after the imposition of Sharia Law in Sudan in 1983. Like many families, my family was forced to flee our homeland, and we eventually lived as refugees in the Central African Republic. Those difficult experiences shaped my faith, resilience, and understanding of God's presence even in suffering.

My vocation story began in a simple but powerful way. As a child, I loved "playing Mass." I would take a sack, cut it, and wear it like a priest's chasuble. The other children often allowed me to be the priest because I could imitate the Mass very well. Looking back now, I realize I was unknowingly acting out the calling God had already planted in my heart.

Still, becoming a priest was not originally part of my plans. Growing up, I dreamed of becoming either a pilot or a doctor. But God's call has a way of gently changing the direction of our lives. While living near a Catholic seminary in the Central African Republic, I spent a lot of time with the seminarians, especially playing soccer with them. One day, when I was about fourteen years old, the rector of the seminary met me on the road and told me, "Go tell your mom you need to pack your things and come to the seminary." That moment changed my life forever.

Entering the seminary did not mean I suddenly had all the answers. I struggled with many questions about faith and God. I often asked myself, "Is God really there?" and "How do I hear God speaking?" Through daily prayer, attending Mass, reading Scripture, and meditation, I gradually came to experience God's love deeply in my heart. Over time, I learned to recognize His voice guiding my life and vocation.

After my seminary formation, I was sent to the Diocese of Phoenix in Arizona. My first parish assignment was at Saint Mary's Catholic Church in Chandler. Later, I began serving as a chaplain at Xavier College Preparatory and Bourgade Catholic High School. Serving young people has become one of the greatest joys of my priesthood. I love accompanying students on their faith journey, especially those who struggle with questions about God, because I understand those struggles personally.

I became an American citizen two years ago, and a year later, I was incardinated into the diocese of Phoenix.

Arizona has become a second home to me. Over the years, I have grown accustomed to the desert heat and have come to appreciate the hospitality and diversity of the people here. At Xavier and Bourgade, I can often be found celebrating Mass, walking around campus, participating in school activities, retreats, prayer days, and simply spending time with students and staff.

I did my first Master's at Arizona State University, where in 2022 I graduated with a Master's in Communication. I graduated with my second Master's from the Catholic University of America with a Master of Science in Ecclesial Administration and Management. Bishop Dolan asked after that to do a certificate course at Villanova University in Church Management for 9 months.

Outside of ministry, I enjoy watching soccer, football, basketball, and tennis. I am also a passionate supporter of Arsenal F.C. I previously played volleyball and enjoy connecting with people through sports and community activities.

One of the blessings of my life has been the gift of languages. I speak English, French, Arabic, and several African languages. Among my favorite languages are the ones in which I can celebrate the Holy Mass: Zande, Arabic, English, and French. Being able to pray and worship with people in their own language is one of the most meaningful parts of my ministry.

Above all, my life has been a journey of discovering God's faithfulness. From a refugee child in Africa to a Catholic priest serving in Arizona, I continue to see God's hand guiding every step of my journey.

I look forward to meeting you and serving the parish of Our Lady of the Lake.

I was born and raised in Tempe, AZ, the oldest of 3 children. Growing up, my family and I were all very active: walking, swimming, biking, hiking, backpacking, running, and martial arts. I went to Catholic school K-12 at St. John Bosco in Ahwatukee and Seton in Chandler, then studied Astrophysics at ASU before entering seminary in the fall of 2018. I spent 7 years at St. John Vianney seminary in Denver, CO before my ordination on June 7, 2025. Now in my spare time I enjoy reading, baking sourdough bread, biking, and running marathons. I have never been to Lake Havasu City before, but as a very new priest I am excited for new opportunities & adventure and am looking forward to joining your parish in July!

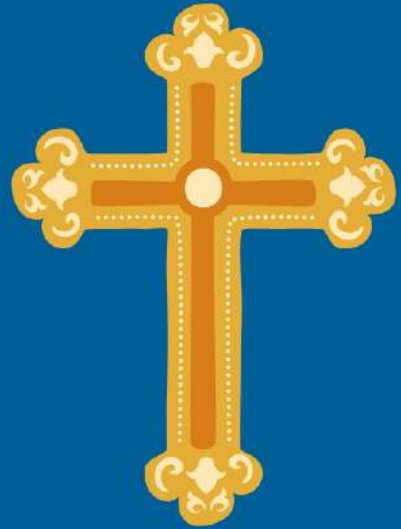

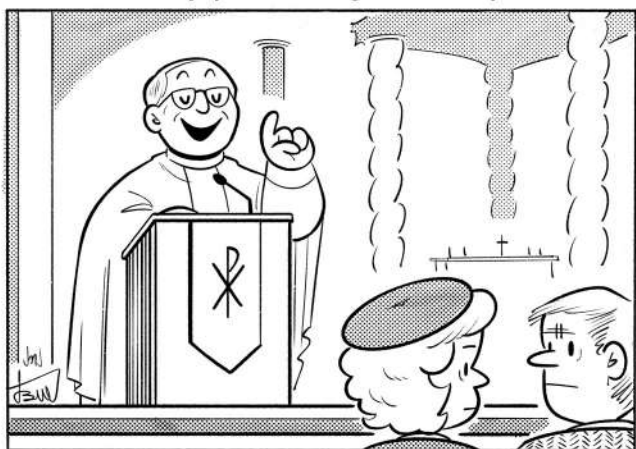

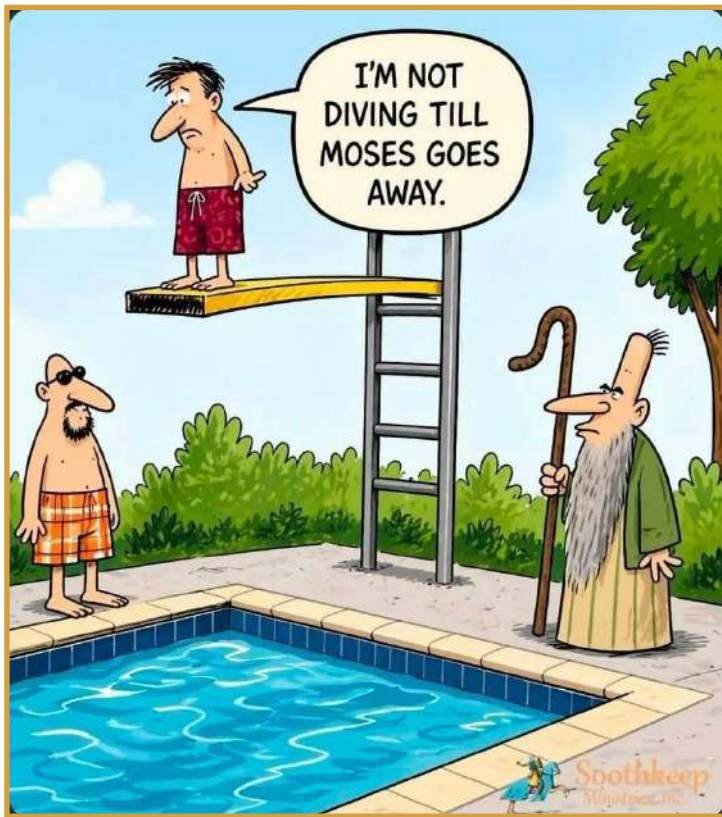
